B. Programs

1. Course re-numbering proposal from Pharmaceutical Sciences, Dr. Jackson
Professor Buss presented an overview of the rationale for the proposed course renumbering for graduate programs in Pharmaceutical Sciences. The vote was unanimous to approve the proposal.
2. Change in Doctoral Degree in Education Sciences for Physical Education Research Program, Dr. Denison.
Unanimous vote to approve a Kinesiology and Health Promotion strand (Physical Education Research) into the Interdisciplinary Ph.D. in Education Sciences program. Approval was contingent on 1) clarification of the number of required strand-specific credit hours in this program and 2) approval of all new proposed courses (KHP 601, 602 and 677).
3. University Scholars proposal between Georgetown College and the Department of Agricultural Economics, Dr. Denison
Unanimous vote to approve this new University Scholars program. Approval was contingent on 1) modification of the stated GPA requirements to be consistent with all scholars programs (3.50 minimum in the major; 3.20 overall) and 2) confirmation that no problems exist with regard to tuition payments from Georgetown College to UK.

C. Courses

1. CE 416G, Water Resources Engineering, Dr. Viele
Unanimous vote to approve the change in title (Hydrology to Water Resources Engineering) and credit hours (3 to 4) for this course in order to accommodate additional information.
2. EE 539, Power Distribution Systems, Dr. Viele
Unanimous vote to approve this new course
3. HIS 615, Manuscript Cultures, Dr. Jackson for Dr. Dubravac
Unanimous vote to approve the change in title of this course from Readings in History of Science and Medicine (through the Renaissance) to Manuscript Cultures. Approval was contingent on receipt of a modification to the course description clarifying that a different sub-title will be required for a student to repeat the course (to the requested maximum of 6 credits).
4. KHP 602, Promoting Physical Activity for Youth, Dr. Berry
Unanimous vote to approve this new course.
5. MFS 610, Lean Systems Logistics/Supply Chain Management, Dr. Viele

Unanimous vote to approve this new course. Approval was contingent on 1) inclusion of a description of the week by week scheduling of lecture and laboratory hours and 2) Removal of "D" from the grading scale.

6. MGT 780, Advanced Social Network Analysis, Dr. Jackson for Dr. Ford (update)
At the last meeting of Graduate Council, approval of this course was contingent on clarification of the grading policy for group project. This information was provided by the program and considered satisfactory by the council.
7. MGT 790, Doctoral Colloquium, Dr. Jackson for Dr. Ford
Unanimous vote to approve this new course
8. NUR 770, Philosophical Foundations of Nursing Science, Dr. Jackson for Dr. Schardl (update)
At the last meeting of Graduate Council, approval of this course was contingent on confirmation that the Department of Philosophy had been consulted during the development of this course. This information was provided by the program and considered satisfactory by the council.
