A. Policy Proposals

1. GRE Suspension

Dr. Feist-Price presented the rationale for the request to suspend the GRE requirement for admission into the Rehabilitation Counseling Master's program. The justification was similar to that of Social Work, which uses other criteria to determine eligibility for admission.

Motion to approve the suspension of the GRE was made by Dr. Bruckner and seconded by Dr. Ford. Vote was unanimous.

B. Programs

1. MS Program in Clinical Research

The proposed program is designed to prepare practicing health care professionals and students pursuing a terminal degree to conduct population-based research and clinical trials. Request made by College of Public Health.

A motion to approve was made with the expectation that the program would determine if the ethics course is required by NIH. If not required, then the ethics course would be an elective. Motion made by Dr. Spear and seconded by Dr. Jensen. Vote was unanimous.

2. **University Scholars, BS in Dietetics and MS in Hospitality and Dietetics Administration/ and BS in Hospitality Management and Tourism and - MS in Hospitality and Dietetic Administration**

The University Scholars Program offers particularly gifted and highly motivated students the opportunity of integrating their undergraduate and graduate courses of study in a single continuous program culminating in both the BA and MS degree. Request made by College of Agriculture.

3. **Graduate Certificate in Distance Education**

A graduate certificate in distance education is being proposed. It will be a collaborative effort between the Dept of Special Education and Rehabilitation Counseling and the Instructional Systems Design program in the Dept of Curriculum and Instruction. Request made by the College of Education.
