- November 19 - Thursday -- Last day candidates for a December 2020 degree can sit for a final examination
- November 24 - Tuesday -- Last day of classes
- November 24 - Tuesday -- Last day candidates for December 2020 degree to submit thesis/dissertation (ETD) for formal review by the Graduate School
- November 25-28 - Wednesday through Saturday -- Thanksgiving -- Academic Holidays
