Kentucky Peace Corps Association to Host Statewide Virtual Screening of A Towering Task: The Story of the Peace Corps

Screening will be accompanied by a virtual panel discussion with the filmmaker

President John F. Kennedy established the United States Peace Corps on March 1, 1961. In the almost 60 years since more than 240,000 Volunteers have served in 142 countries.

To share that history the Kentucky Peace Corps Association will host a virtual screening of the film *A Towering Task: The Story of the Peace Corps* and a virtual panel discussion. The film will be available to be viewed from February 20, 2021 – February 22, 2021.

A Towering Task: The Story of the Peace Corps is the first big picture documentary about the Peace Corps and explores the program's history and legacy, told through interviews, archival materials and more. The film is narrated by Annette Bening.

The KPCA is hosting this screening as part of the organization's mission to educate and inform Kentuckians about the Peace Corps. To further the conversation about the Peace

Corps beyond the film, the KPCA will be also be hosting a virtual panel discussion on **February 21, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. EST**.

The panel discussion will feature the director of the film, Alana DeJoseph. DeJoseph will be joined by three of Kentucky's Returned Peace Corps Volunteers, representing different decades across the history of the program.

Book Launch Event for America's Public Philosopher: Essays on Social Justice, Economics, Education, and the Future of Democracy

Graduate School's Community Enhancement Program cordially invites you to attend the book launch event for Dr. Eric Thomas Weber's edited anthology of essays by John Dewey titled 'America's Public Philosopher: Essays on Social Justice, Economics, Education, and the Future of Democracy'.

Dr. Weber is an associate professor of educational policy studies and evaluation at the University of Kentucky. He is the author of 'Uniting Mississippi: Democracy and Leadership in the South' (2015) and 'Democracy and Leadership: On Pragmatism and Virtue' (2013), among others. He is also an executive director of the Society of Philosophers in America and cohost of the Philosophy Bakes Bread radio show and podcast. His commitment to public scholarship is an example for all intellectuals.

Book Description: "Dewey was a founder of a distinctly American philosophical tradition, pragmatism, and he spoke out widely on the most important questions of his day. He was a progressive thinker whose deep commitment to democracy led him to courageous stances on issues such as war, civil liberties, and racial, class, and gender inequalities. ... These essays inspire optimism for the possibility of a more humane public and political culture, in which citizens share in the pursuit of lifelong education through participation in democratic life. America's Public Philosopher reveals John Dewey as a powerful example for scholars seeking to address a wider audience and a much-needed voice for all readers in search of intellectual and moral leadership."

Tax Workshops For International Students

It's taxes time! All international students who are on an F or J visa and were physically in the U.S. during the tax year 2020 are expected to complete and file tax and/or other

related federal forms with the U.S. federal government. Filing a federal tax form is required for all international students, even if they did not work during the prior year. If you did work in 2020 and filed correctly, you may get money back! The average tax refund for UK was \$715 last year.

Applicants in transdisciplinary research areas such as Microelectronics, Data Science, Conservation Laws and Symmetries, and Accelerator Science are strongly encouraged to apply. Researchers at the University of Kentucky invite you to participate in a research study examining muscle activity. This study looks to investigate how weight and exercise affect muscle weakness and muscle activity. Participants will be required to make four visits to the exercise physiology and biomotion lab. In exchange for your participation, you will be compensated \$40 upon completion of the study.

You may be eligible to participate if you:

- Are a 20 40 year old female
- Have a BMI of 18 to 40
- Are premenopausal
- Are not currently taking medications which contribute to muscle weakness
- Do not have arthritis, low back or lower extremity injury
- Have not had low back or lower extremity surgery within the past 6 months.
