Our 2021 Live Virtual Showcase will include a keynote by Professor Kevin Gannon, author of [Radical Hope: A Teaching Manifesto](#) (West Virginia University Press, 2020). An activist, teacher, and public intellectual, Gannon writes for the Chronicle of Higher Education and speaks on the themes of social justice and teaching as a “radical act of hope.”

Gannon’s keynote is co-sponsored by [The Graduate School](#) and [Center for the Enhancement of Learning and Teaching](#). 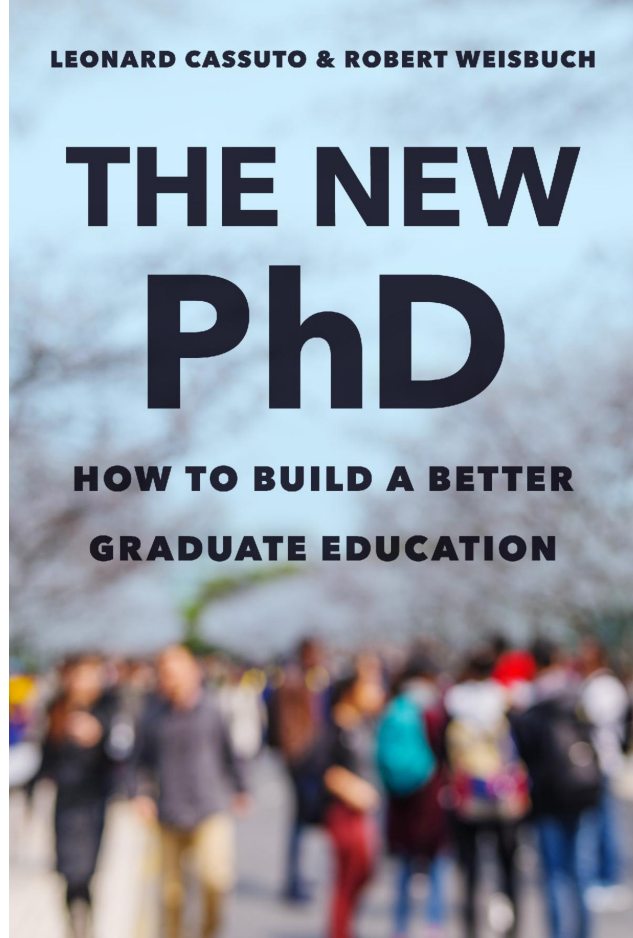

The Department of Gender and Women's Studies invites you to an exciting conversation with Dr. Emily Thuma, author of *All Our Trials: Prisons, Policing, and the Feminist Fight to End Violence* (University of Illinois Press, 2019) and Assistant Professor of U.S. Politics and Law at The University of Washington, Tacoma. Office of Postdoctoral Research at The Ohio State University College of Medicine to Hold Virtual Recruitment Event for Prospective Postdocs

The Office of Postdoctoral Research at The Ohio State University College of Medicine is excited to announce a Virtual 2021 Spring Postdoctoral Recruitment Event on April 26! Interviews will occur April 27-30.

This event will provide an excellent opportunity for outstanding postdocs and PhD students from leading graduate programs to meet our research faculty, interview for open

postdoctoral positions, and discover the exciting and innovative research taking place at The Ohio State University and the Research Institute at Nationwide Children's Hospital (NCH).

Application for this event is open to postdocs or senior graduate students who have completed or expect to complete their PhD by August 2021.

Any candidate in the US (visa status does not matter) can apply. We are especially interested in reviewing applications from US Citizens and permanent residents who are training grant-eligible. Individuals from groups underrepresented in the biomedical workforce are strongly encouraged to apply, including students from racial and ethnic groups shown to be underrepresented nationally and individuals with disabilities. Selected candidates will be invited to attend a virtual event. Participants will learn more about the Ohio State campus and Columbus, Ohio, network with current Ohio State and NCH postdocs, present their research to faculty in a virtual presentation, interview with prospective mentors, and learn more about postdoctoral opportunities at Ohio State and Nationwide Children's Hospital.

Candidates selected to attend the virtual 2021 Spring Postdoctoral Recruitment Event may be considered for a variety of opportunities at Ohio State, including fellowships, training grants, and other internal training programs.

Every year, the entire Graduate Student Congress (GSC) Congressional body elects the next year's Executive Board at the April General Assembly Meeting. Per the [GSC Constitution and By-Laws](#), nominees for the Executive Board must be enrolled in graduate or professional studies or be a postdoctoral scholar at the University of Kentucky (UK) during the duration of their term and be in good academic standing. Nominees for President must have been involved with the GSC for at least six (6) months prior to the election in April. Self- and other-nominations are permitted. For self-nominations, interested individuals should submit a letter of intent to the GSC President. For other-nominations, send an email to the GSC President with the name and contact information of the person you are nominating, along with the title of the Executive Board position and a justification for their nomination. The GSC President will contact the nominated individual to ask if they would like to accept or decline their nomination. If the nominated individual accepts, then they will be asked to submit a letter of intent to the GSC President. If the nominated individual declines, then their name will be removed from consideration. At the April General Assembly meeting, nominees will confirm their nomination and be given the chance to speak as an eligible candidate. If a nominee wishes to be considered for the Executive Board, but cannot be present, the nominee's letter of intent can be read aloud instead, or the nominee can pre-record a short video statement.
