

Student Fellowship Application Materials Checklist

To begin the fellowship application process, you will need to complete the [Online general application](#).

Information you will need for the general application are:

1. Your LinkBlue ID
2. Your Student ID Number (Excluding the first 9 on your WILDCARD ID)
3. Your current Admission Status (i.e., new or continuing student and program of study)

After you have successfully completed your general application, specific opportunities may be available.

Information/materials you will need for all opportunities are:

1. Undergraduate and/or graduate GPA
2. Copies of Unofficial Transcripts from all schools attended (undergraduate and graduate) combined into a single pdf file
3. GRE/GMAT Percentiles, as well as a scanned copy of unofficial scores (or a document indicating such are waived by your program)
4. A resume or Curriculum Vitae
5. Name & Email addresses of 2 Individuals that can serve as references of recommendation for you
6. A personal statement providing background information pertaining to your experiences, accomplishments, and overall strength of candidacy (750-word limit)

Some applications require additional information and/or materials. Examples are:

1. DGS Nominated fellowships require a specific DGS Nomination form, signed by your DGS. Copies of these forms can be found below each specific opportunity on the Graduate School's Fellowship page, or at: <http://gradschool.uky.edu/DGSNOMFORMS>
2. The Cralle Foundation/Joan Cralle Day Fellowship requires the name and email of the chief academic officer at your baccalaureate institution (This person will serve as a reference as well as a provider of information on your degree completion status)
3. The McNair Fellowship requires documentation of participation in a McNair Scholars Program (a note from the program's director is preferred)
4. The Lyman T. Johnson Fellowship requires your DGS to serve as a third reference for you so you need their name and email address as well. Applicants should include a personal statement regarding how they personally contribute to the University of Kentucky's compelling interest in diversity.
